TRANSCRIPTS

Providing you have submitted all your required coursework – and no revisions are necessary – your transcript will be issued after the Exam Board held following your last date of enrolment. Usually these are held in late January, mid-April, early June and mid-August (re-sits only). Your transcript will be sent to your home institution and will usually show both GSA credits, ECTS and a grading guide.
