**7. Course Aims:**

The course aims to:

- Enable students to work with a significant level of autonomy in the production of a critical reflective journal;
- Further develop the ability to identify and formulate critical insights into established practice;
- Further encourage informed critical reflection upon the relations between the student's own practice and current issues within the field of design;
- Encourage students to devise and explore alternative modes for the effective presentation of research material and articulations as proof of research.

At the end of the course, each student should have the ability to:

- Demonstrate an advanced understanding of the relations between studio practice and theory;
- Demonstrate an attitude equipped to identify, conceptualise and define new problems and

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<b>9. Indicative Content:</b>
The content to a large extent will come from the extended discussion with staff from the initial project proposal and will relate closely to studio based activities.

For this course, students must submit a critical reflective journal. Though this may take a variety of forms, it could be a 2500 word written essay (this should include examples of visual work, where appropriate, and a bibliography).

Students will be required to demonstrate evidence of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Reflection on their educational journey via evidence of reflective processes and/or self-assessment.</li> <li>• Evidence of an informed collation and organisation of visual and textual materials related to their project</li> <li>• A coherent verbal presentation of the design intentions, including insights and omissions.</li> <li>• A body of work contained within the CRJ which has developed from the original project proposal</li> <li>• Independent learning, self-direction, decision making, initiative and personal responsibility.</li> </ul>
