

Equality Monitoring Report: Students

The Glasgow School of Art



2016/17

INTRODUCTION

This report presents an overview of GSA's equality monitoring data as it relates to the protected characteristics of students on degree level programmes. Data relating to student pregnancy and maternity is not included in order to preserve anonymity given relatively small numbers.

The 2016/17 data for each protected characteristic is presented in a discrete section. Where it is available data for the previous four years is also included. For a longer data period previous years monitoring reports are available at <http://www.gsa.ac.uk/about-gsa/publications/>

Programme level equality data is generated and used for programme monitoring and reporting purposes and for equality impact assessment. It is not reproduced here in order to ensure anonymity within often small cohorts, however, the collation and use of local level data underpins and informs equality mainstreaming activity at GSA alongside the overview presented within this report.

Sector level benchmarking data for the year 2016/17 will be included in this report when it is available in late 2018.

The data used in this report is that of students studying GSA degree level programmes in the UK. Data for students studying GSA programmes in Singapore (SIT) is not included.

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DATA SOURCES: Please note the UCAS figures have been produced from the figures reported in the End of Cycle report supplied to the School from UCAS. All other statistics are generated from internal documentation produced from the data recorded during enrolment for the period concerned and are audited by being processed via the School's HESA return.

ETHNICITY

Data on race/ethnicity is collected with reference to the identifiers used by the Higher Education Statistical Agency (HESA) however to preserve anonymity and enable analysis these identifiers have been condensed for the purposes of this report into Black, Asian, Minority Ethnic (BAME) and White. Data on race/ethnicity is presented relative to all students and in relation to UK domiciled students only.

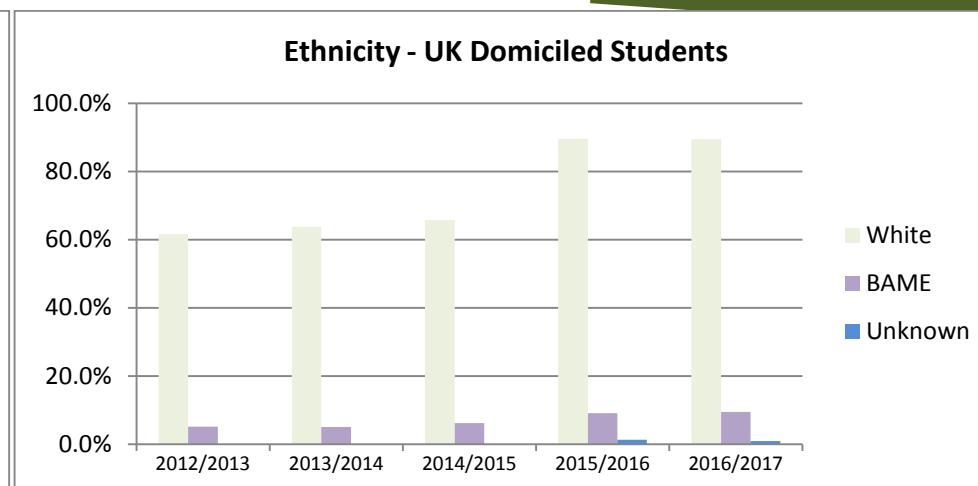
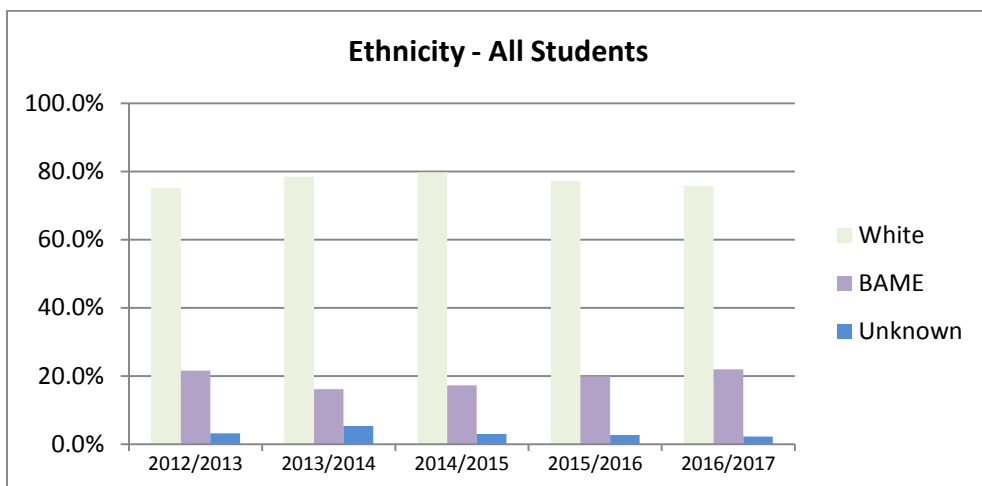
Overall BAME Student Population

- In 2016/17 22% of the overall GSA student population identified as BAME. (37% Chinese, 24% Other Asian background. 3% Black Caribbean or African).
- In 2016/17 19% of undergraduate students and 33% of postgraduate students identified as BAME.
- The degree attainment gap between the total BAME and White student populations narrowed from 21% in favour of White students in 2015/16 to 2% in favour of White students in 2016/17. This level of volatility is consistent in the attainment gap data since 2012/13.

UK Domiciled BAME Student Population

- In 2016/17 9% of all UK domiciled students were from BAME backgrounds.
- The number of applicants from BAME UK domiciled backgrounds has risen marginally to 8.2% of applicants with a 9% conversion to offer as compared to 10% conversion for White UK domiciled applicants.
- 89% of UK domiciled BAME students were studying undergraduate degrees.
- The degree attainment gap between UK domiciled students from White and from BAME backgrounds was 7% in favour of BAME students in 2016/17.

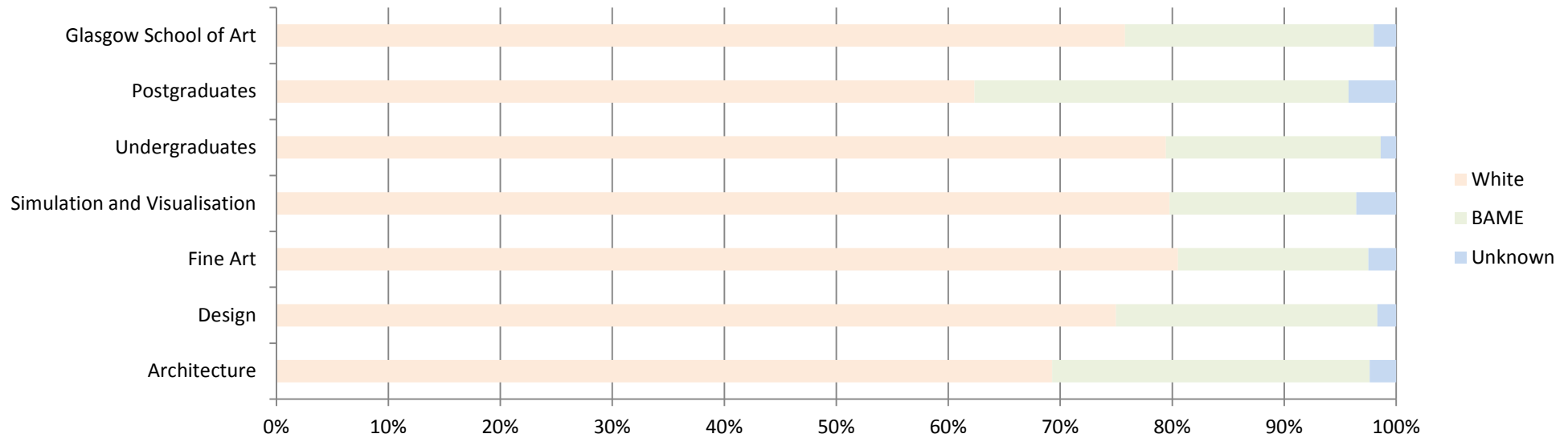

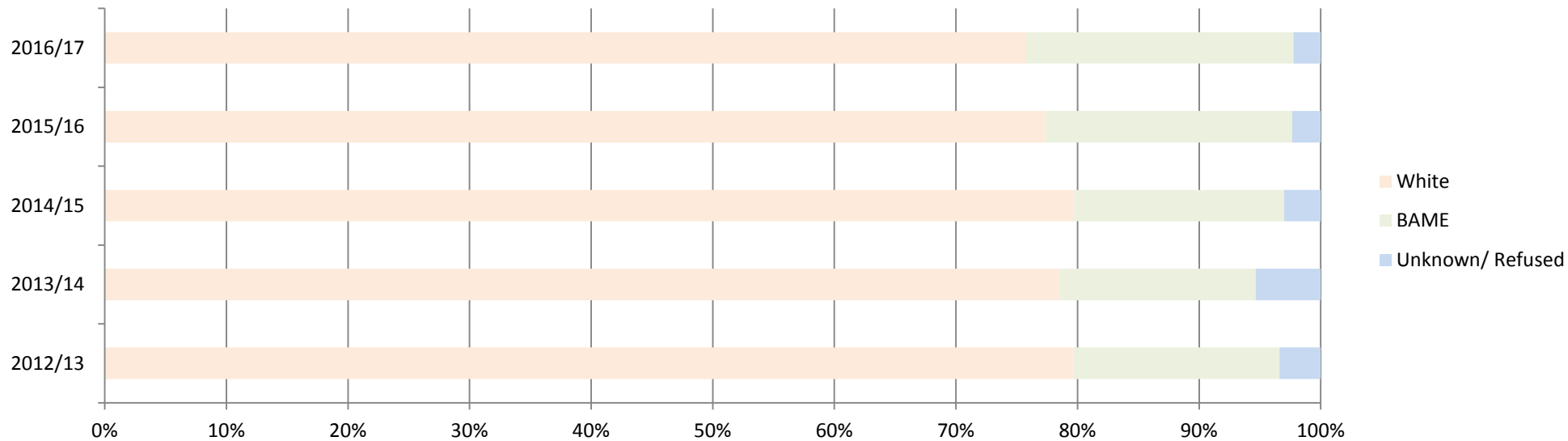
Ethnicity - All Students by School and Level of Study

Year on Year Ethnicity - All Students

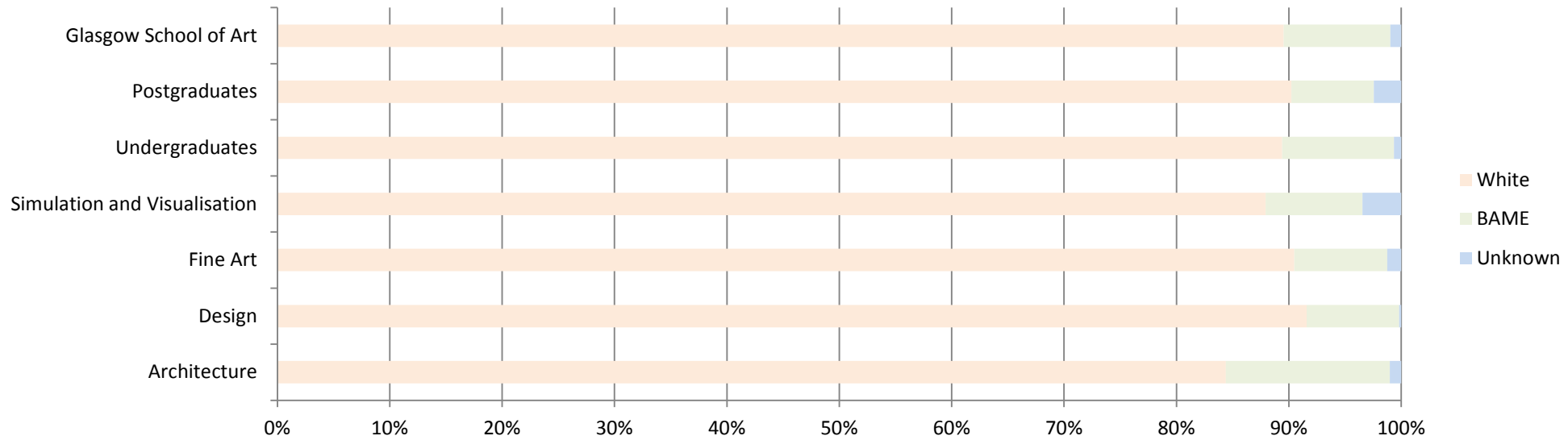

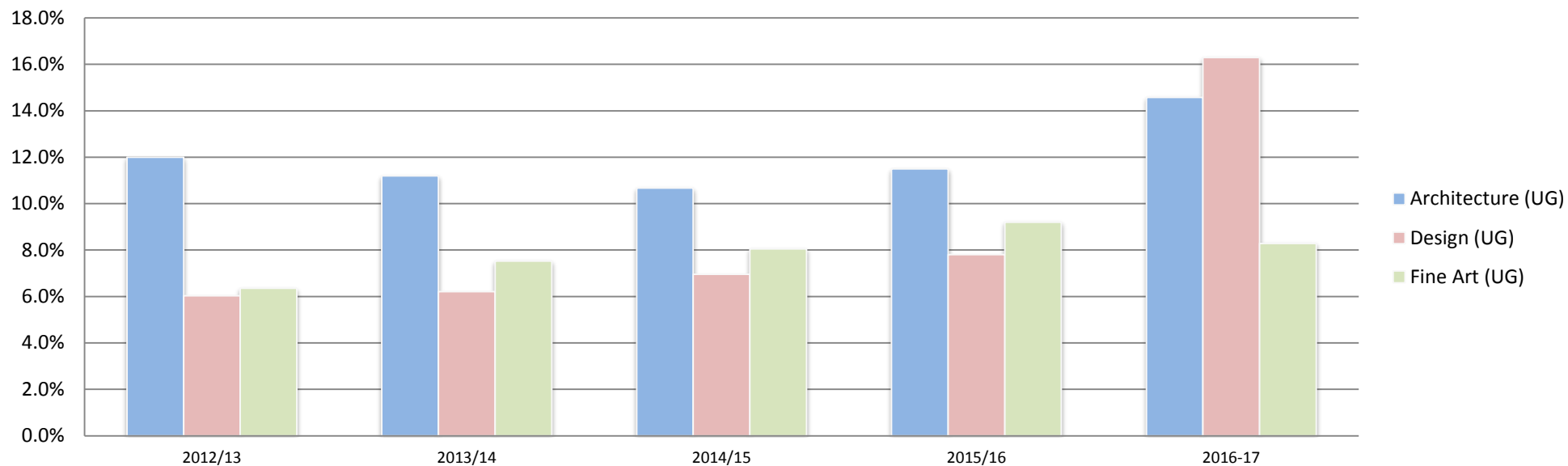

Undergraduate UK Domiciled BAME Students by School of Study

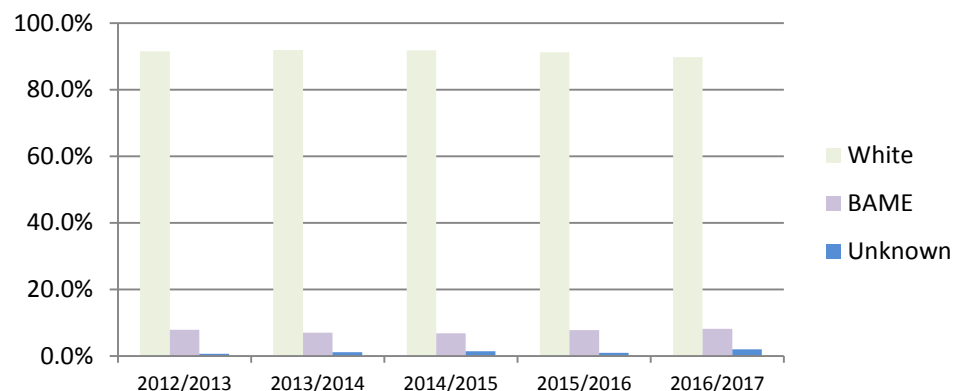

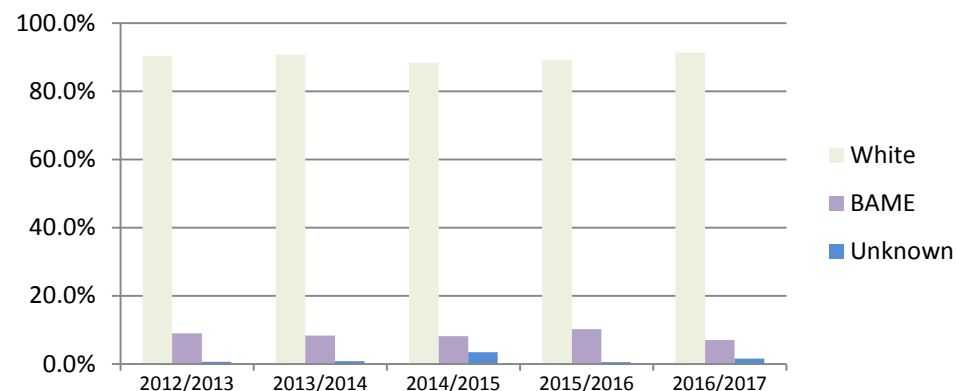

Ethnicity - UCAS Acceptances (UK DOMICILE ONLY)

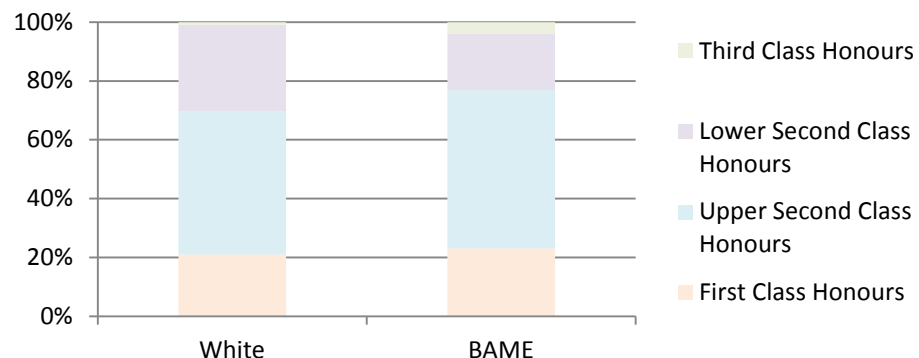

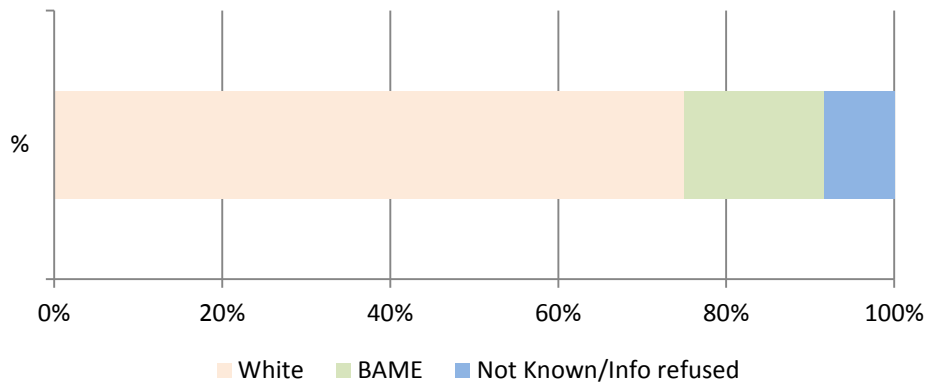

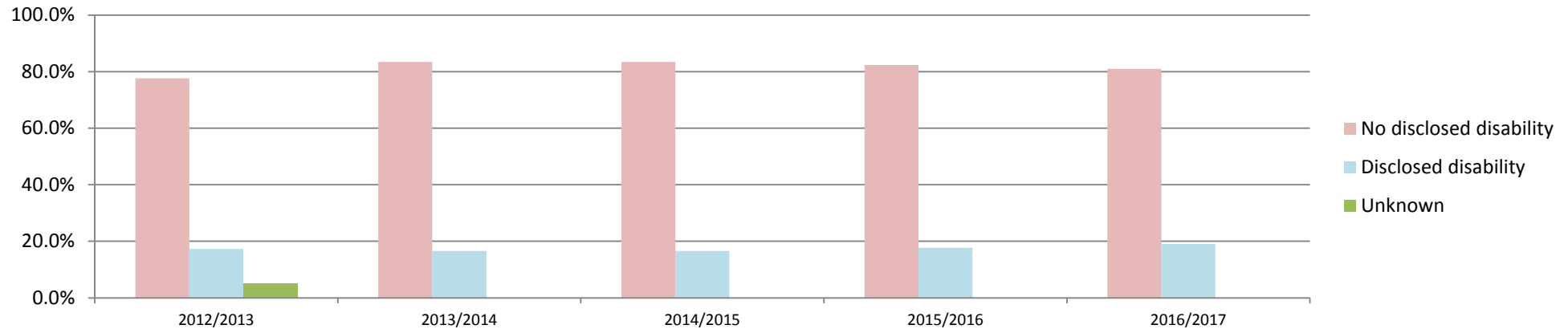
DISABILITY

GSA uses the HESA disability categories for monitoring purposes.

- In 2016/17 19% of GSA Students disclosed a disability and 52% of these students were in receipt of Disabled Student Allowance (DSA).
- 21% of undergraduate students disclosed a disability and 11% of postgraduate students. The School of Fine Art continues to have the highest percentage of disabled students at 23%.
- The number of applicants disclosing disability has continued to increase. 12% of applicants disclosed a disability in 2016/17. The proportion of disabled applicants accepted onto programmes at GSA was 10%; the same proportion as for those who did not disclose a disability.
- The degree attainment gap between students who disclosed a disability and those who did not was 6% in favour of students who had disclosed a disability.

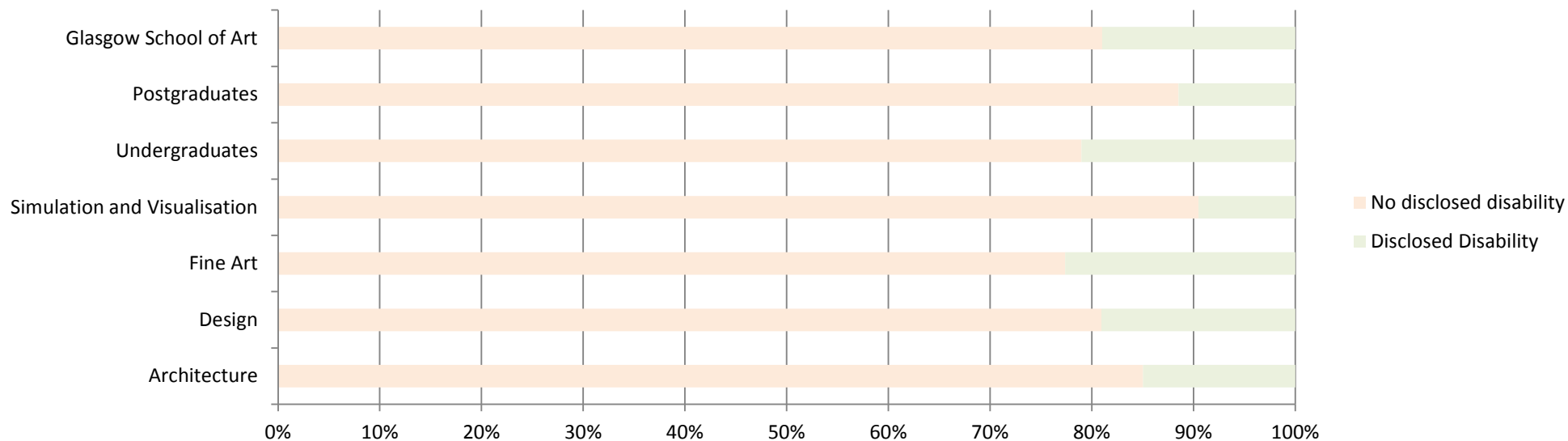

Disability -All Students by School and Level of Study

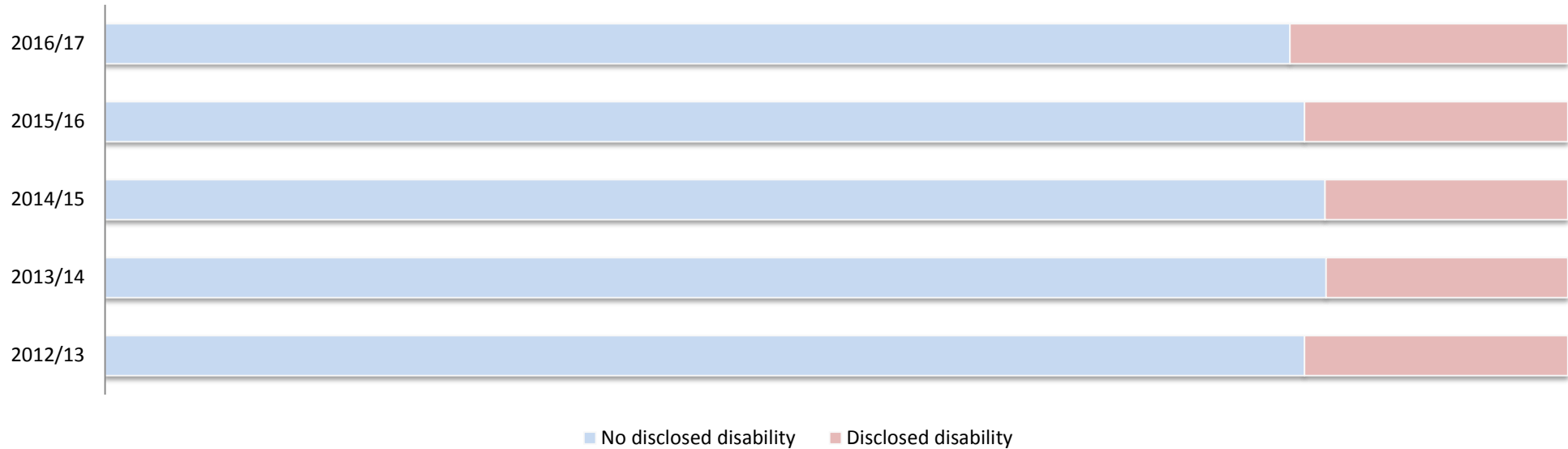

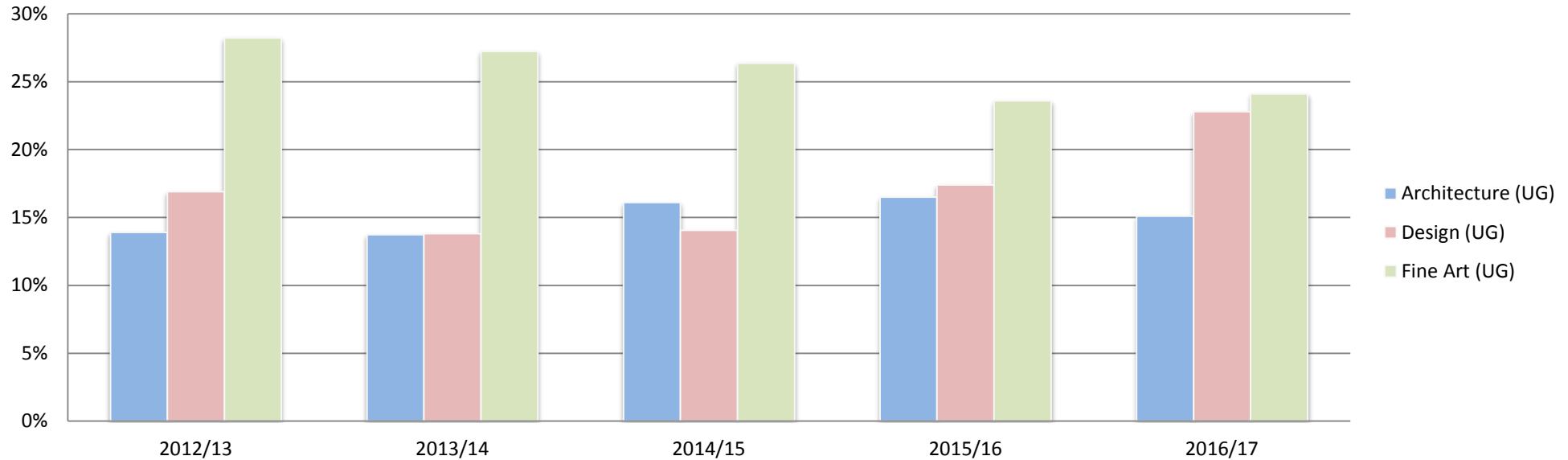
Year on Year Disability (GSA - All Students)

Undergraduate Students with a Disclosed Disability (GSA)

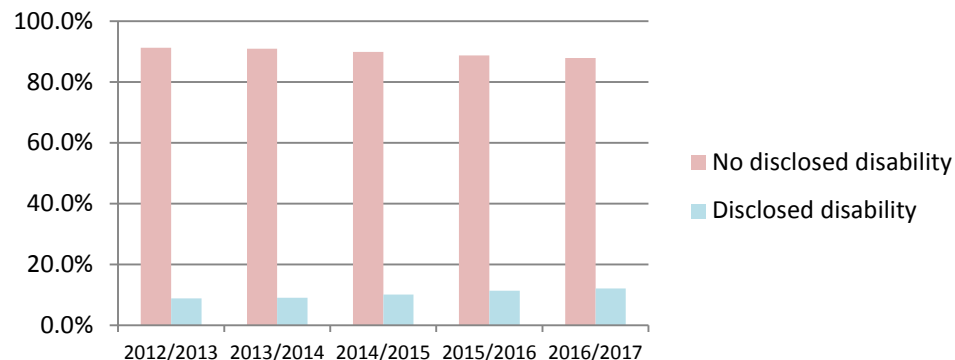

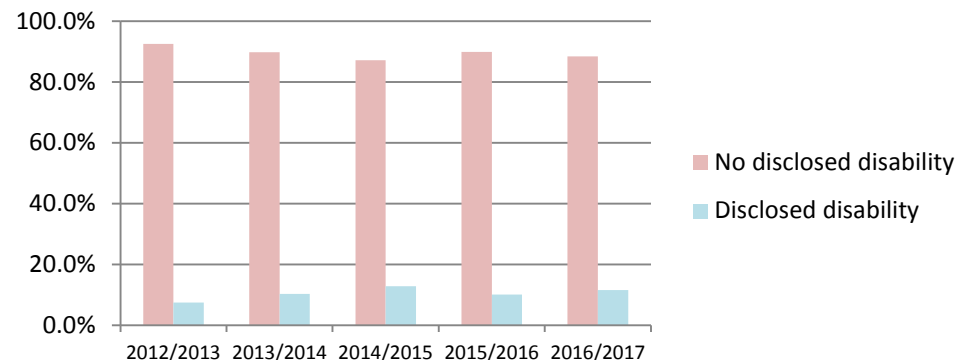

Disability - UCAS Acceptances

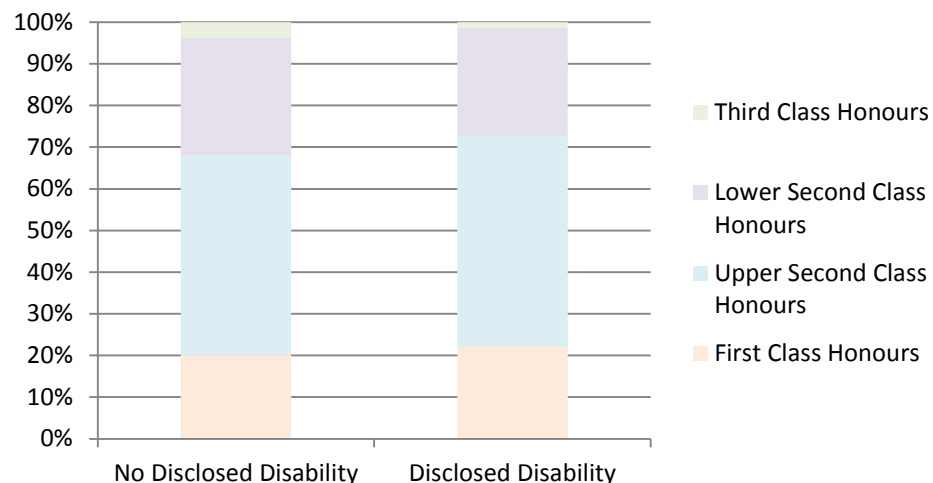

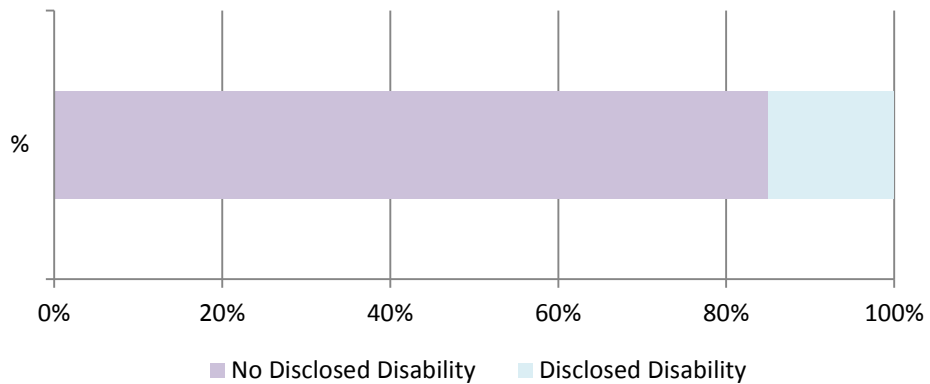

Withdrawals by Disability*



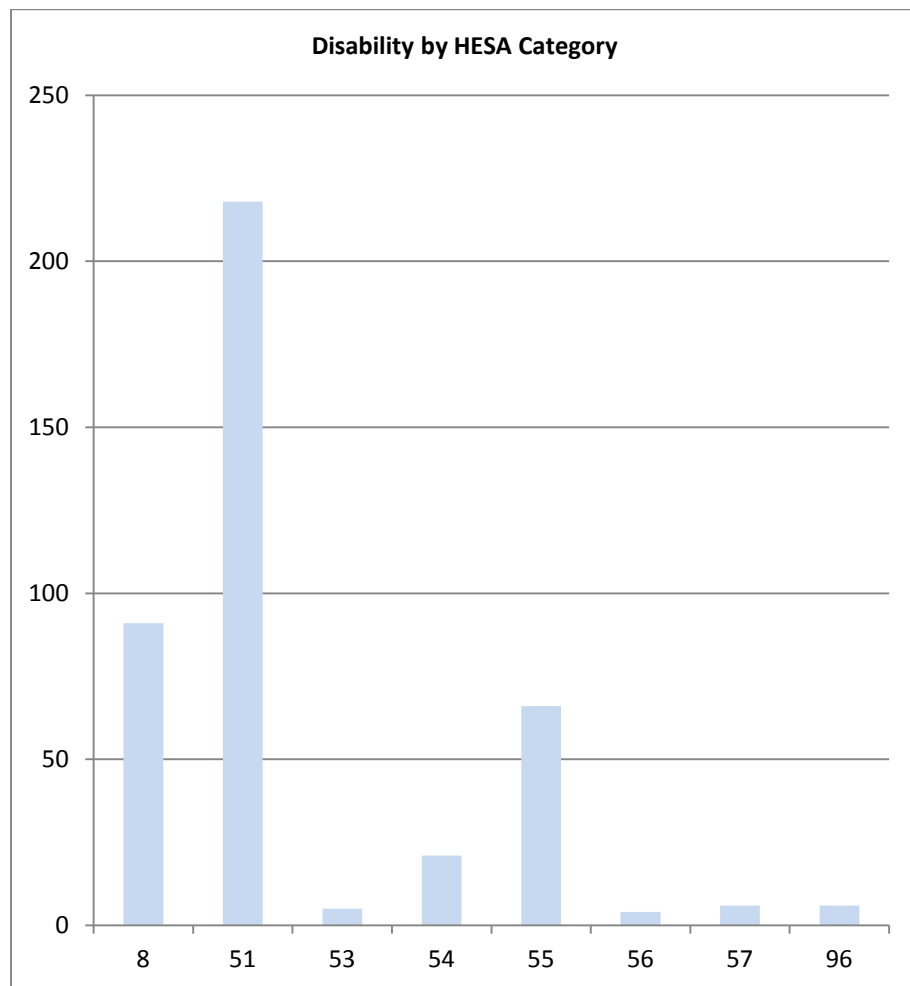

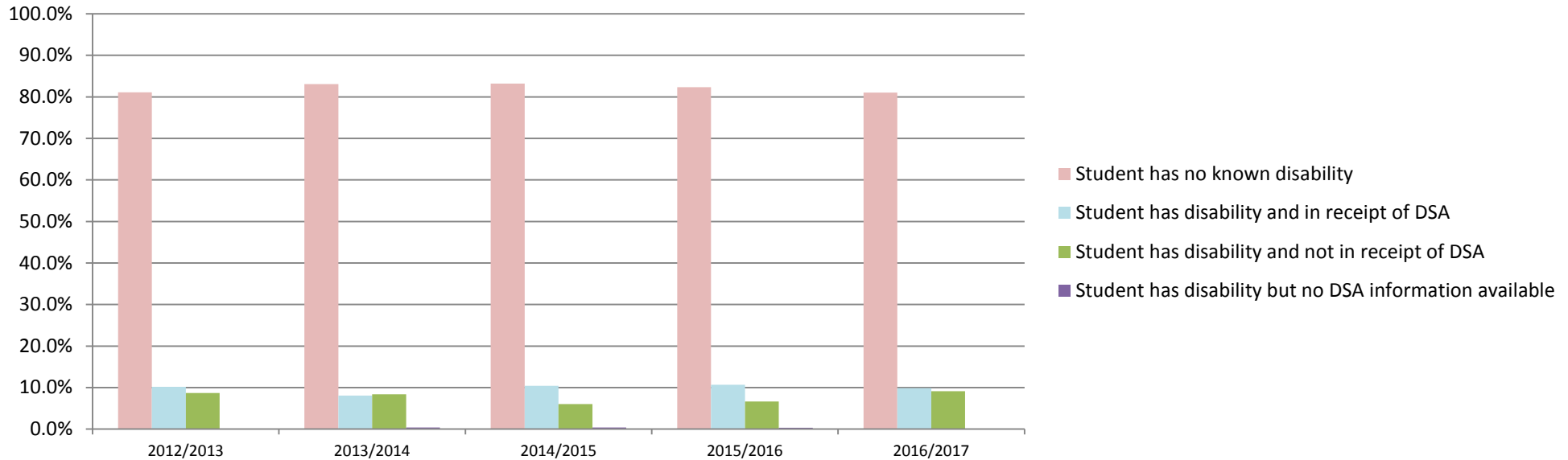

SEX AND GENDER IDENTITY

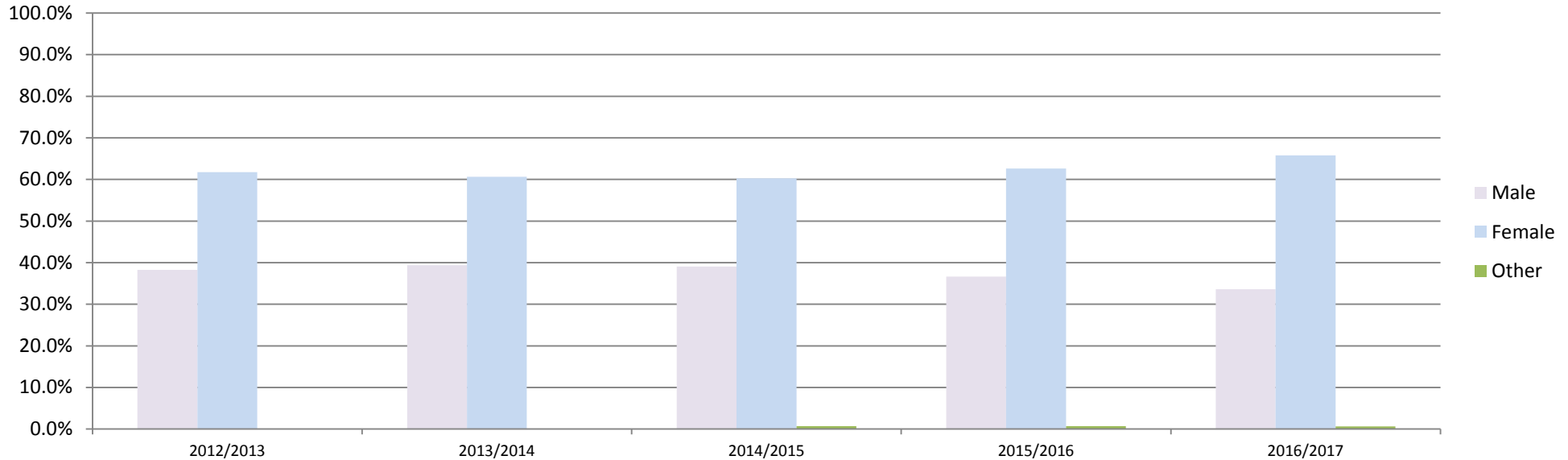
Sex identity data relates to student identification as female, male or other. The category other includes those who associate with the terms intersex, androgyne, intergender, ambigender, gender fluid, polygender and genderqueer.

Data which specifically references gender identity indicates students who do or do not identify with the sex that they were assigned at birth. Trans identities are therefore represented in this data.

- The proportion of male students at GSA continued to decline with a 4.7% decrease in male students between 2015/16 and 2016/17.
- Conversion to acceptance in 2016/17 was slightly higher for men at 11% than for women at 10%. The higher conversion to acceptance for male applicants has been maintained over the period 2010/11 to 2016/17.
- In 2016/17 there was no degree attainment gap between males and females.
- In 2016/17 the proportion of students who do not identify with the sex they were assigned at birth was 2%. This proportion has been consistent since 2014/15.

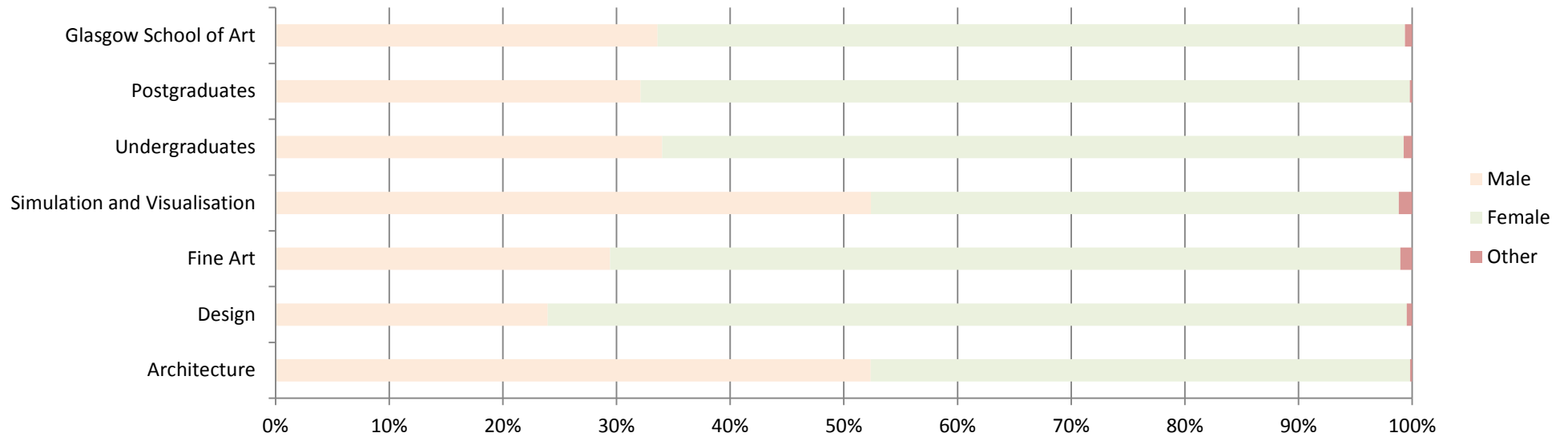

Sex Identity-All Students by School and Level of Study

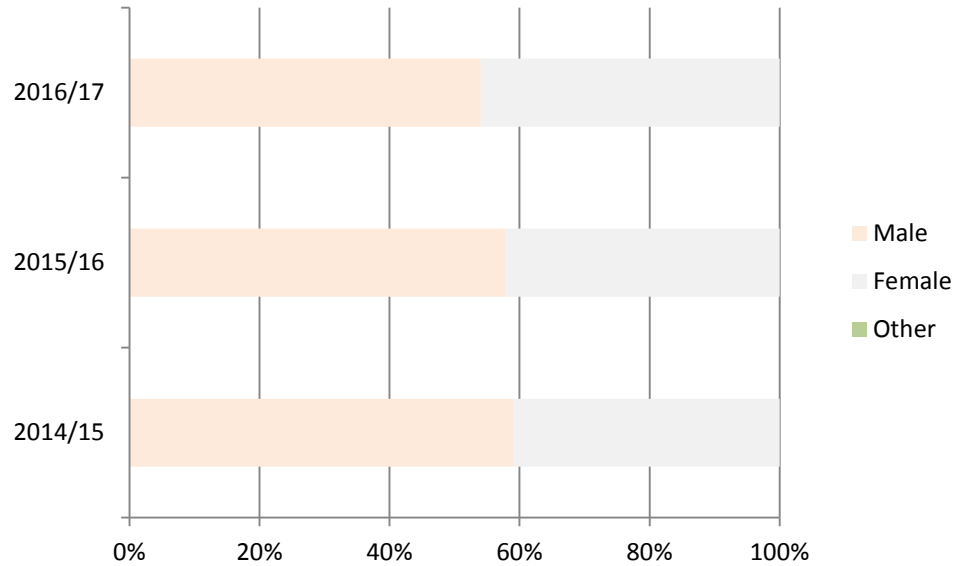

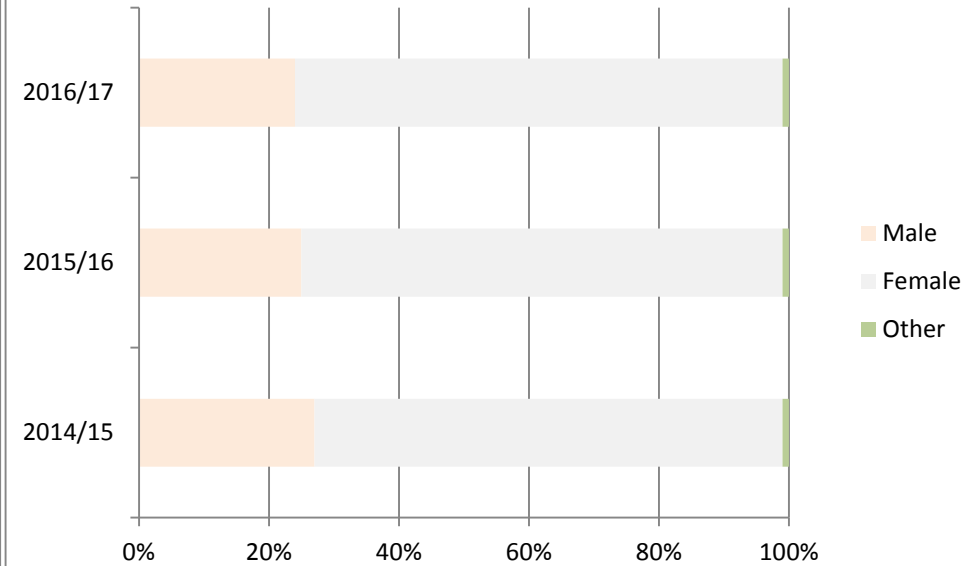

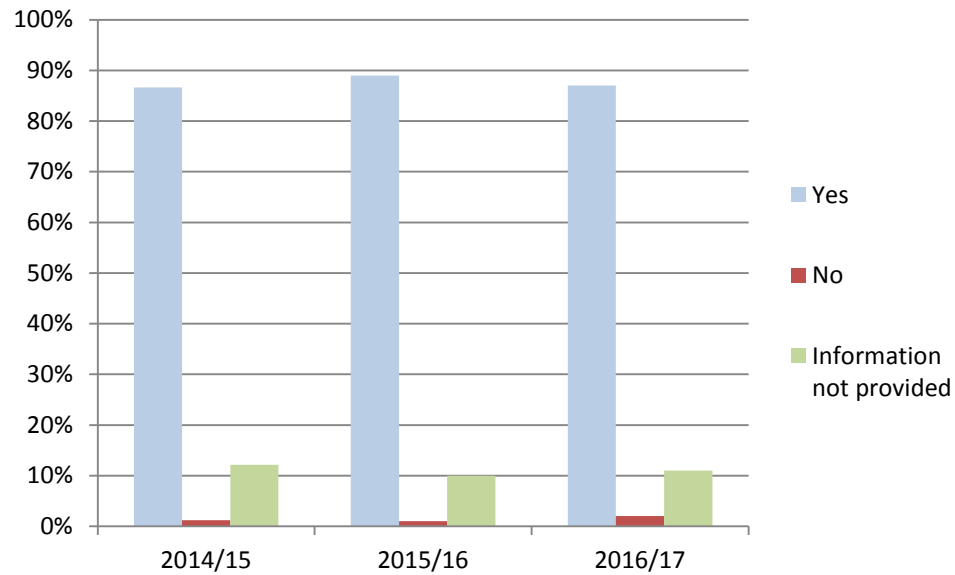

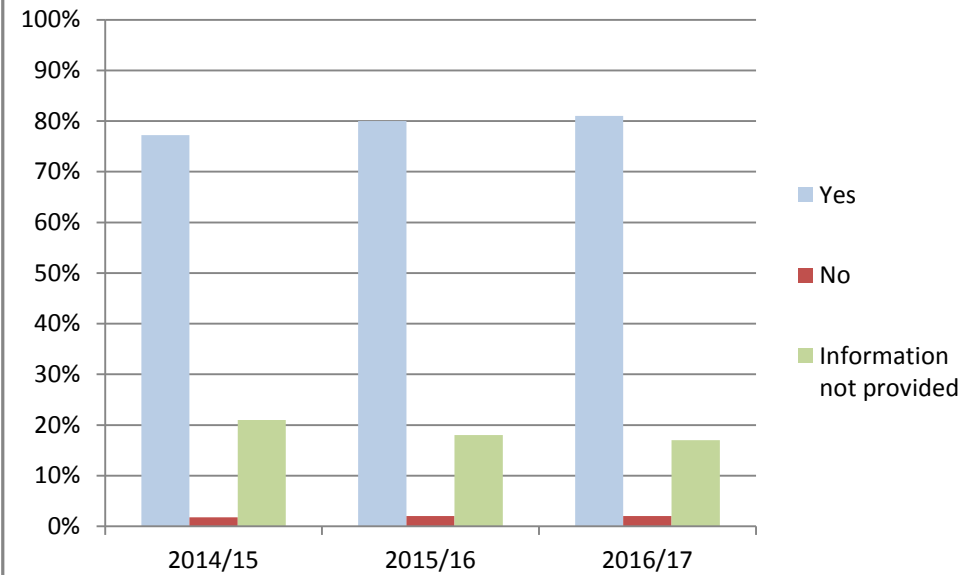

AGE

- The age profile of students at GSA has changed very little in the five-year period from 2012/13.
- In 2016/17 the conversion rate in the 19-20, the 22-24 and the 25-39 age groups was between 11%/13% (14%/15% in 2015/16). The conversion rate for the over 40 age group was 6%. Conversion rates for those in the 17 and under group increased from 7.5% in 2015/16 to 13% in 2016/17.
- In 2016/17 33% of the students withdrawing from their studies were in the 22-24 age group, however withdrawal as a proportion of the total cohort of 22-24 year olds was 3% and broadly in line with the proportion of withdrawal for other age groups.
- The withdrawals for those aged 40 and over as a proportion of that age group cohort was slightly higher at 5%.

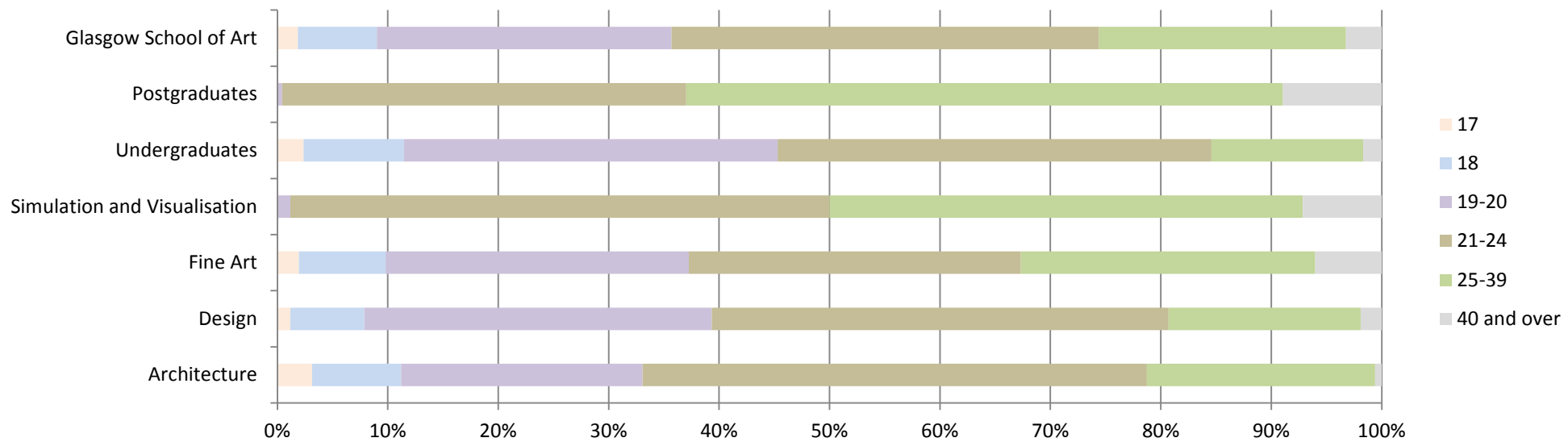

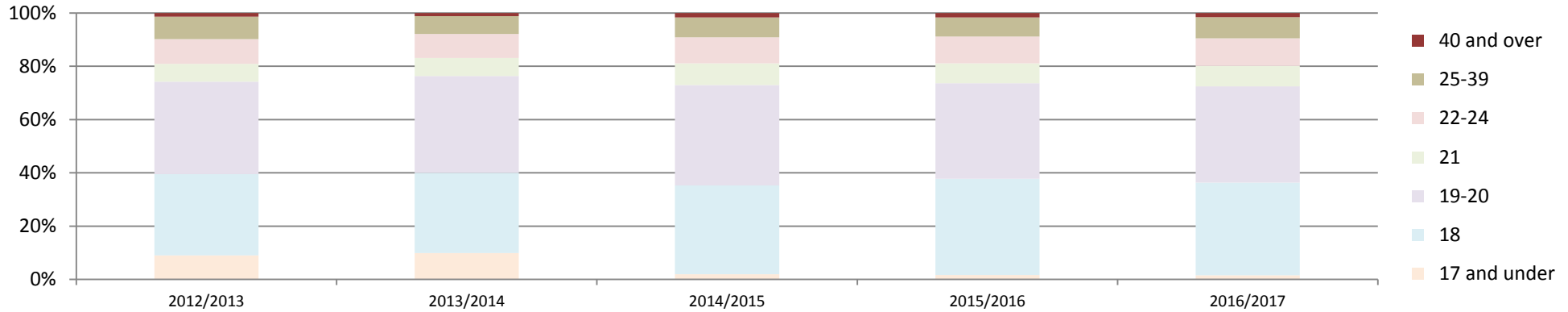

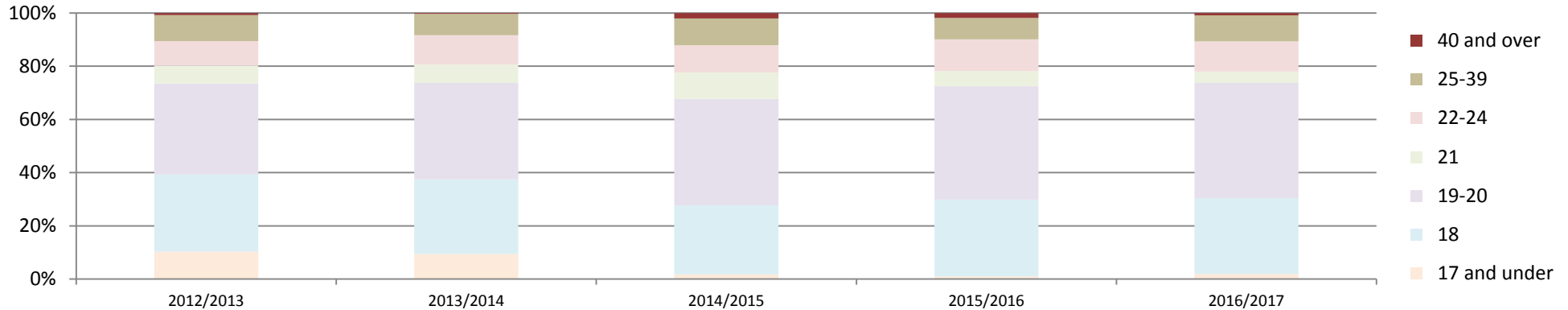

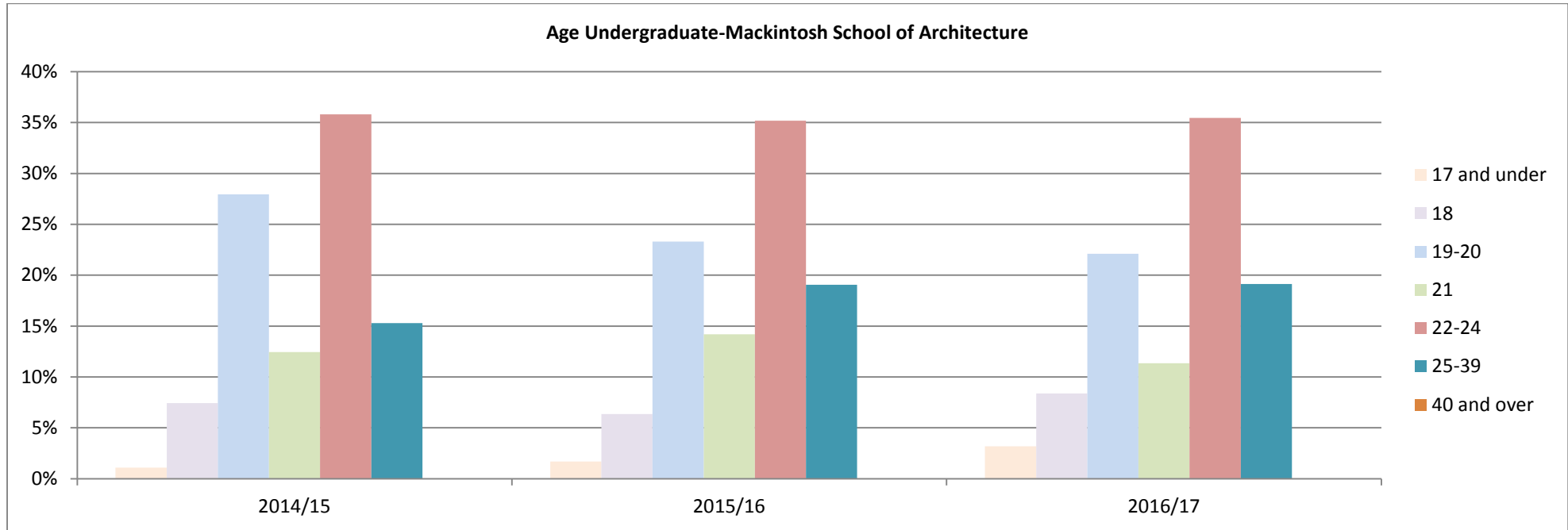

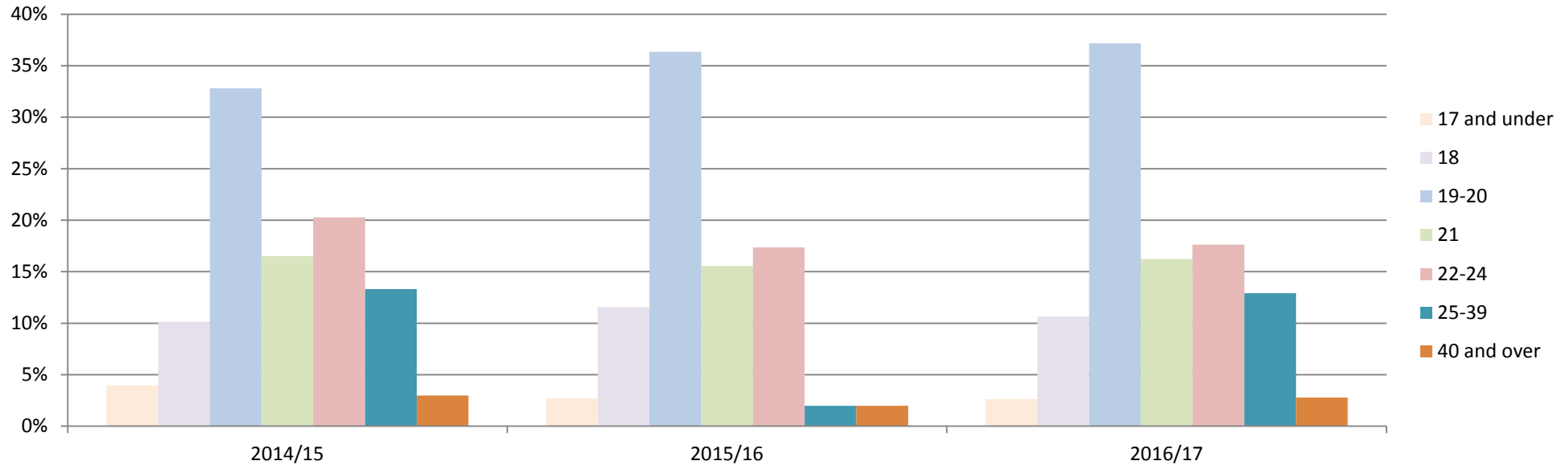

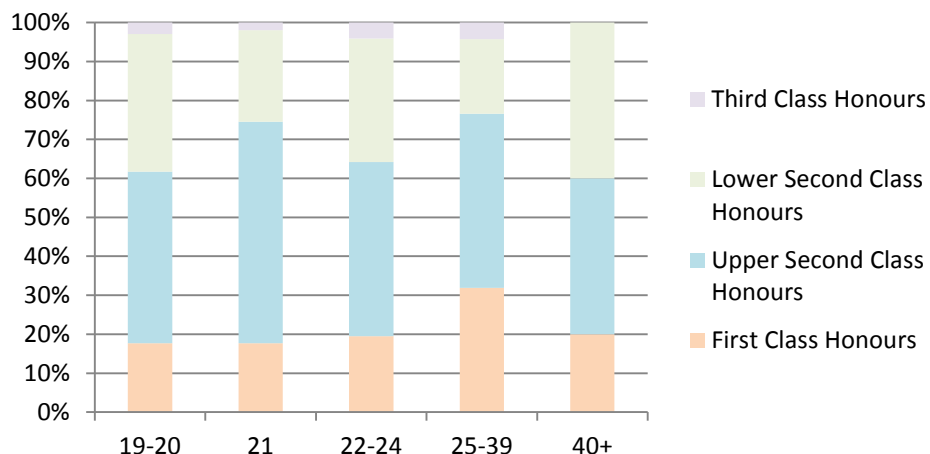

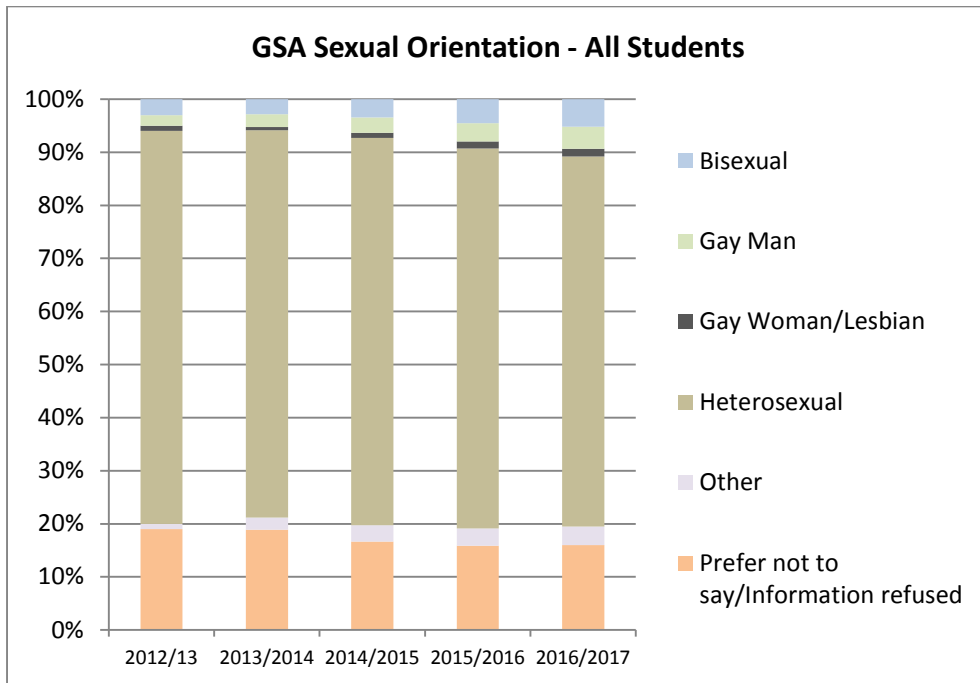

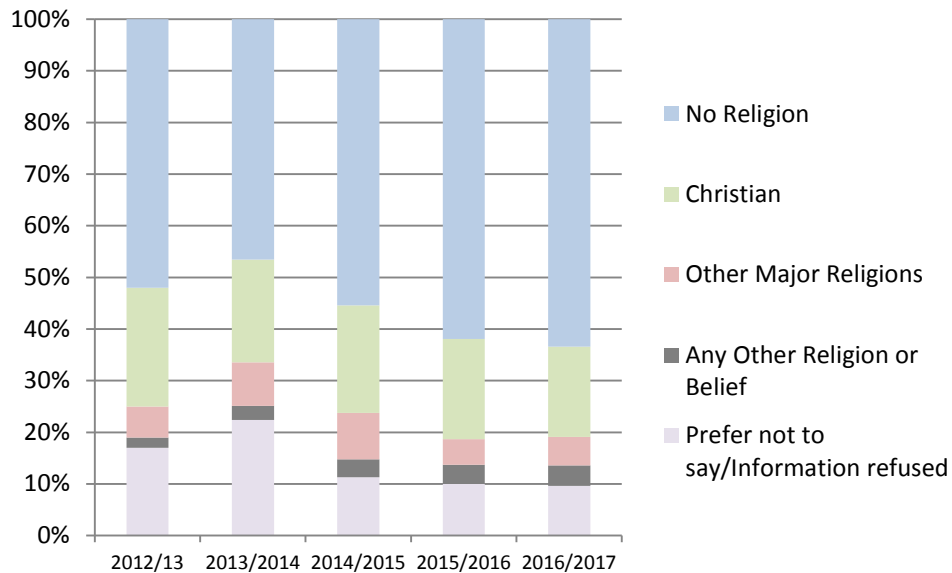
SEXUAL ORIENTATION

- 69.7% of students at GSA identified as heterosexual in 2016/17, a reduction of 4% since 2012/13.
- The number of students identifying as Lesbian, Gay or bisexual has increased by 98% since 2012/13 and students describing their sexual orientation as 'other' has increased by 370%.
- 16% of students chose not to say or refused to give information about their sexual orientation in 2016/17 (19% in 2012/13).

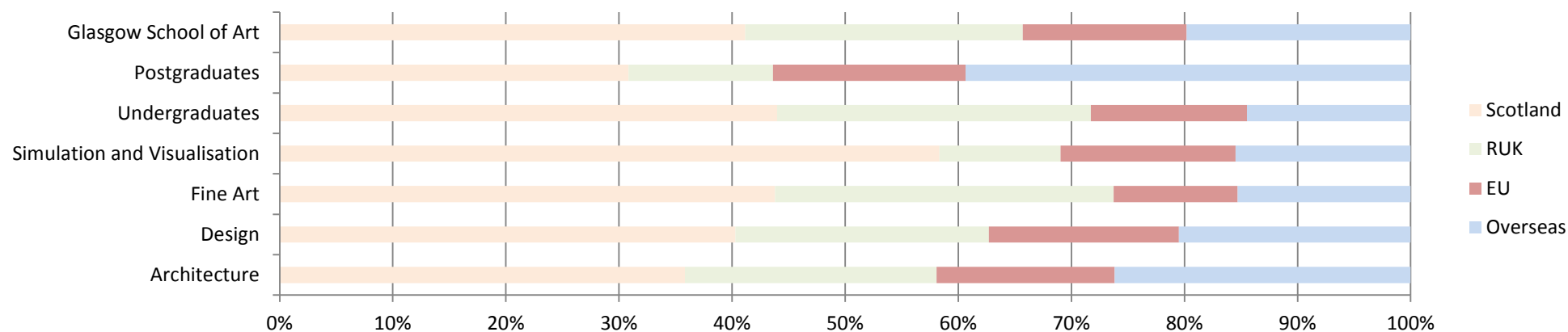

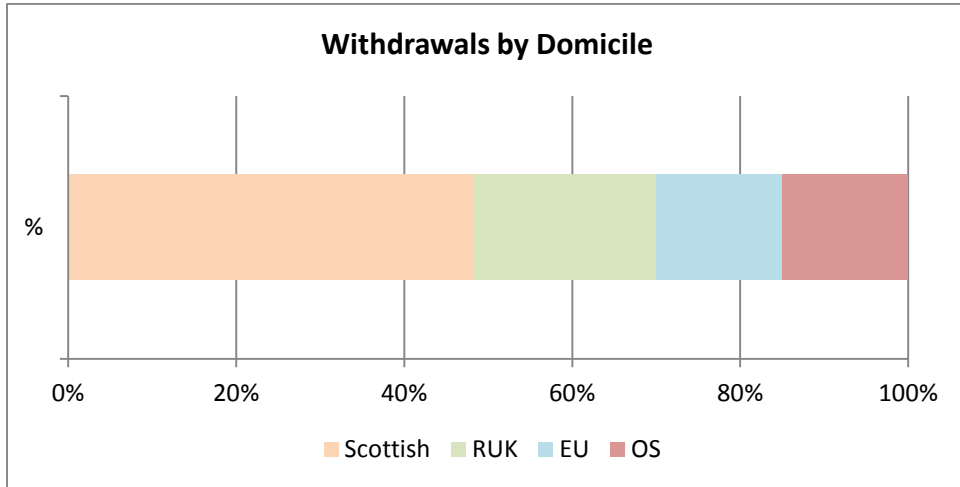
