Through UCAS: All undergraduate applicants (except Study Abroad & Exchange) should apply online at ucas.com using GSA's institutional code **G43**. The deadline for applications is 30 June, although we advise all students to apply by 15 January. **Direct:** For Postgraduate, Study Abroad and Exchange programmes, we accept direct applications. Direct applications are completed using our online application forms found on our website.

Visas, work & health

- Students from Canada coming to study in the UK will need to apply for prior Entry Clearance (a Tier 4 General Student Visa for programmes over six months) before travelling to the UK.
- The UKVI may require you to show evidence of £1,015 per month for living expenses at the time of your visa application.
- Students with the correct stamp in their passports are able to work for up to 20 hours a week during semesters and full time in vacations.
- Students coming for programmes of study of under six months may apply for a Short Term Study Visa.
- Students may not work with a Short Term Study Visa or extend their stay.
- When making an application for a Tier 4 General Student Visa, a fee will be levied to cover access to the National Health Service (NHS).

Tuition fees

(New International Students) 2018/19

Undergraduate Students

- Full-degree/International Foundation programmes £16,800 per year.*
- Study Abroad students £15,000 for full year, or £7,500 for a semester.

Postgraduate Students

- Most one-year Masters programmes £17,640.
 - MSc Medical Visualisation & Human Anatomy £27,000.
 - Two-year taught Masters programmes £17,640 per year.*
 - Research Degrees £16,000 per year.*
 - Postgraduate Certificate in Learning and Teaching/Supervisory Practice £5,880

Entry requirements

English Language Requirements

Students will need to evidence that they have reached an acceptable level of English language skill through their high school or CEGEP qualification.

Academic Requirements

Undergraduate: (Information for other provinces is available from our Admissions Team). Alberta: 65% (B) in five grade 12 (30 level) subjects. British Columbia: 65% in five grade 12 subjects (preferably five grade Bs) (Dogwood Diploma/Secondary Sch Grad Dipl). Ontario: 70% in six 4U or 4M courses. Quebec: The Diplome d'Etudes Collegiales (DEC) awarded after two years of study at a 'college d'enseignement general et professionnel' (CEGEP) is acceptable as satisfying general entrance requirements. Students with an International Baccalaureate will need 30 points for entry to most programmes.

Postgraduate: An Honours degree will satisfy entry requirements onto postgraduate programmes. The Lowest Grade Point Average (GPA) should be six on nine Point GPA and 2.7 on four Point GPA, both reflecting an average grade of B-.
