**Through UCAS:** All undergraduate applicants (except Study Abroad & Exchange) should apply online at [ucas.com](http://ucas.com) using GSA's institutional code **G43**. The deadline for applications is 30 June, although we advise all students to apply by 15 January.

**Direct:** For Postgraduate, Study Abroad and Exchange programmes, we accept direct applications. Direct applications are completed using our online application forms found on our website.

## Visas, work & health

- Students from Norway do not need to apply for prior entry clearance (visa) to study or work in the UK.
- All International Students studying in the UK for over six months are entitled to the same free Health Care under the National Health Service as UK nationals.
- Students coming for less than six months should apply for an EHIC.

## Tuition fees

**(New International Students) 2018/19**

### Undergraduate Students

- Full-degree/International Foundation programmes £16,800 per year.\*
- Study Abroad students £15,000 for full year, or £7,500 for a semester.

### Postgraduate Students

- Most one-year Masters programmes £17,640.
  - MSc Medical Visualisation & Human Anatomy £27,000.
  - Two-year taught Masters programmes £17,640 per year.\*
  - Research Degrees £16,000 per year.\*
  - Postgraduate Certificate in Learning and Teaching/Supervisory Practice £5,880

## Entry requirements

### English Language Requirements

Students who have studied English at Upper Secondary level to at least year 10 and have obtained grade 4 or above in both written and spoken English in the Vitnemal fra den Videregaende Skole. Students who are not EEA citizens, or who do not have the above grades will need to provide a Secure English Language Test with results as shown below:

- IELTS 5.0 (min 5.0\*\*).
- Most Undergraduate Programmes: IELTS 6.0 (min 5.5\*\*).
- Architecture and most Postgraduate Programmes: IELTS 6.5 (min 5.5\*\*).

### Academic Requirements

**Undergraduate:** Students would be expected to have obtained average marks of four or above in their Vitnemal fra den Videregaende Skole. Students with an International Baccalaureate will need 30 points for entry to most programmes.

**Postgraduate:** Candidates must obtain a minimum C grade in the new Bachelor degree system.
