Guidelines for Applicants

Academic Entry Requirements

- Normally a UK Bachelors honours degree (or its international equivalent) in a relevant/ related subject that gives appropriate grounding for postgraduate study.
- If you do not meet these academic entry requirements, we may still consider your application on the basis of your portfolio and or relevant professional experience.
- We seek to enrol self-motivated students who are determined critical thinkers, professionally orientated and understand that their commitment to the programme is a significant investment in their future.

Deadline dates

- The programme begins in September. Although there are no application deadlines early application is encouraged in order to ensure a place on the programme.
- **Guaranteed Review**
- All complete applications received by the Standard 1 deadline to apply of **27 January 2023** will be reviewed. Where programmes are over-subscribed, we cannot guarantee to review applications received after this date.
- Applications are reviewed on a cyclical basis from October – August as shown below. Your application will need to be complete (part 1 and 2) by the date shown to enter the next review.
- **GSA scholarships**
Students wishing to apply for a GSA scholarship should ensure their application is submitted by the Standard 2 deadline of **10 March 2023**. This ensures they have time to receive an offer of their place, this is required in advance of submitting scholarship application.

Application Process

- Your application will be forwarded to assessors when you have submitted:
 - A completed postgraduate application form
 - A personal statement

In addition you will be required to submit:

- Evidence of academic qualifications
- Two academic referees
- If English is not your first language, you will be expected to provide evidence of attainment equivalent to International English Language Test (IELT) for UKVI Academic from a UKVI approved test centre. We require a score of 6.5 overall, with a minimum of 5.5 in each component. GSA's preferred test is the IELTS for UKVI (Academic) test taken at a UKVI approved test centre. - A copy of your passport (if applicable)

We would prefer all additional information to be sent at the same time as the application form and personal statement.

Personal Statement

- Your statement should consist of no more than 500 words. Statements that are longer may not be fully read.

It should be a genuine reflection on why you are interested in pursuing a career in curating and give a clear sense of the key areas you wish to explore. The statement should demonstrate that you have researched the programme and indicate the reasons why you think it is best suited to the future development of your practice

- You may write about:
 - your reasons for applying to the MLitt Curatorial Practice programme.
 - your interests and experiences within your practice;
 - what you hope to gain by studying on the programme;
 - what you will contribute to the MLitt
 - how undertaking the programme corresponds with your future ambitions.

Assessment Criteria

Application Form and Statement

Applications are assessed against the following criteria:

- Academic qualifications and relevant experience.
- Good first degree or equivalent professional experience.
- Interest and motivation to study at GSA with the University of Glasgow
- Potential contribution and development within the MLitt Curatorial Practice programme.

Assessment Criteria

Interview

Interviews will be assessed based on the following criteria:

- Ability to discuss your approach to Curating
- Awareness of Contemporary Art and other relevant contexts.
- Capacity for independent thought and collaborative work.
- Critical awareness of the potential development within your working practices.
